
Report on results and details of Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS):

Findings:

- 1) It is observed that 83.3 % students responded that 85% and more of their syllabus were covered in the class.
- 2) It is observed that 64.1% of students responded that their teachers preparation for the classes was satisfactory.
- 3) It is observed that 67.9% of students responded that teachers have an effective communication.
- 4) It is observed that 50% of students responded that the teacher's approach to teaching can best be described and 37.2% expressed that it is very good.
- 5) It is observed that 67.9% of students responded that teachers are always fair in the internal evaluation process and 21.8% felt that it is usually fair.
- 6) It is observed that 83.3% of students responded good about the teacher's discussing about their performance in assignments.
- 7) It is observed that 65.4% of students responded that the institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for them regularly and 17.9% felt it is done often.
- 8) It is observed that 51.3% of students responded that the teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitates them in cognitive, social and emotional growth significantly and 32.1% were of the opinion that the institution facilitates cognitive, social and emotional growth very well.

- 9) It is observed that 59% of students agreed that their institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.
- 10) It is observed that 93.6% of students responded that their teachers every time and usually inform about expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.
- 11) It is observed that 89.8% of students responded that their mentor every time and usually does a necessary follow-up.
- 12) It is observed that 61.5% of students responded that their teachers every time illustrate the concepts through examples and applications and 29.5% set that the teachers usually illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.
- 13) It is observed that 88.4% of students responded that their teachers fully and reasonably identify the strength of students and encourage them with providing right level of challenges.
- 14) It is observed that more than 53.8% of students responded that their teachers are able to identify the students' weaknesses and help to overcome them and 32.1% of the teachers usually do it.
- 15) It is observed that 89.8% of students agreed that the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.
- 16) It is observed that 65.5% of students are agreed with the fact that, their institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences to a great extent and 26.9% expressed

that the teachers use student centric method moderately .

- 17) It is observed that 57.7% and 23.1% of student responded that they strongly agree that teachers encourage participation in extracurricular activities.
- 18) It is observe that 71.8% of students responded that to great extent the teachers inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills.
- 19) It is observed that 59% student responded that above 90% of teachers use ICT tools followed by 32.1% student responded between 70-89% and 10% responded between 50 to 69 %.
- 20) It is observed that 70.5% responded that they strongly agree and 21.8% agree that the overall quality of teaching-learning process in the institute is very good.



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
